## **POLICIES AND TERMS OF COURSE**

#### **General Terms**

- 1. Must be able to actively participate and devote the time and commitment required to complete the Leadership Commerce City Program.
- 2. Write an essay on *What Leadership Means To Me.* (500 words or less).
- 3. Must attend 8 classes to graduate. (first Friday of every month starting September 6, 2019) The first class is mandatory.
- 4. I agree to be interviewed by members of the Leadership Commerce City Committee as part of the application process.
- 5. Interviews will be completed by August 9th, 2019.
- 6. Notification will be sent out regarding acceptance by email.
- 7. Application deadline is July 31, 2019. Payment is due with the application.
- 8. Application must be completed (foundation.adams14.org).

#### **Cancellation & Refund Policy**

1. Cancellations must be made in writing and received by the Leadership Commerce City Administrator by 5:00 p.m. on the dates specified below.

2. Cancellations before August 9th will be given a full refund of any tuition paid.

3. Cancellations after August 16th and prior to the start of the opening session will be given a 50% refund of the full tuition amount. If scholarship money has been provided, no tuition refund will be provided to the participant. If no tuition has been paid, 50% tuition will be due.

4. Cancellations the day of the opening session and after will be given no refund. Any candidate who misses the first session will be dropped from the class and will still be responsible for the full tuition amount.

5. Even though circumstances do arise, any participant missing more than two sessions may not graduate with the class, and no portion of tuition will be refunded.

6. In addition, any participant who does not fulfill all the attendance requirements related to class projects and capstone project may not graduate with the class, and no portion of tuition will be refunded.

#### **Attendance Policy**

In order to accomplish Leadership Commerce City's objectives, the full commitment and participation of each individual session is necessary. Participants are expected to attend all sessions including:

1) First Session September 6th, 2019.

2) Sessions are held on the first Friday from September 6th, 2019 to June 5th, 2020 (unless otherwise noted). The session time is 8am to 4 pm.

3) Graduation Program–2-hour session and ceremony on June 19, 2019.

4) A Capstone Project is required independent of class sessions. (Must be completed prior to graduation).

A maximum <u>excused</u> absence time of <u>sixteen (16) hours</u> will be allowed during the program year. Time absent will be counted if a class member arrives to a session late or leaves early. Please arrive on time and stay until the session ends.

If a class member is absent more than the allowed sixteen hours then the participant must submit a written statement to the Leadership Commerce City Committee as to the reason for the absence(s).

#### **Commerce City**

The Committee may decide to require the class member to make-up the day by attending a Leadership Commerce City session the following year, doing an independent study day, writing a one-page typed paper about the topic missed, or attending some alternate event, etc. and will be handled on a case by case basis.

Absences over the allowable sixteen hours may be excused only because of severe illness, catastrophe, or extenuating circumstances based upon a written statement to, and approval by, the Leadership Commerce City Committee. Participants that are absent more than sixteen hours will be required to attend those sessions missed the following year and may be able to graduate with future classes.

Class members will be kept informed throughout the program year of the number of hours they have been counted absent.
